Without looking it up in *Footprints of Assurance*, can you identify the name of the insurance company that issued the above fire mark? I bet some of you said the Home Insurance Company, Cincinnati, Ohio. Bulau did also; it's his #283. Not being able to verify the dates of 1857 – 1883 gave me reason to question Bulau's information. There are simply too many books and references available for the company not to be found.

It wasn't until I found a reference to the company in the "Annual Report of the Secretary of State, To the Governor of the State of Ohio for the Year 1861" that I knew my hunch was right. Page 9 had the following entry,

"Home Insurance Company of Cincinnati. Decree of Court changing name to "The Franklin Insurance company of Cincinnati." Filed July 9, 1861."

While there was a Home Insurance Company of Cincinnati whose dates were 1857 - 1861, did this company issue the mark?

Look at the mark closely. Notice that the city, "Cincinnati," is above the company's name, "Home." Every other mark has the city under the company's name. Check it out! Was the city on top to differentiate the Home of Cincinnati from the other companies named Home, especially the Home of New York? Not likely, when I discovered the following.

There was an insurance company named the Cincinnati Home Insurance Company. The next page contains a copy of their ad in the 1865 Williams' Cincinnati Directory.

The Cincinnati Home's certificate of association was filed September 20, 1864 and the last reference is from the 1868 Williams' Cincinnati Directory that lists "Arch. Mirrieless, Assignee" of the company.

Based on the above, Bulau's mark #283 should correctly be attributed to the:

Cincinnati Home Insurance Company Cincinnati, Ohio, 1864 - 1868.
